Rosh Chodesh—Today we announce the new month of Adar. Rosh Chodesh begins Thursday night and continues through Shabbat. Just 3 weeks until Purim!

Yom Hamishpacha—In the 1990s, the last day of Shevat (and first day of Rosh Chodesh Adar this year) was designated as Family Day in Israel. The day also commemorates Henrietta Szold, founder of Hadassah.

Shema Time—From now through the beginning of March, the time for Kriyat Shema is before 9:30. Be aware and say it earlier if needed.

Daf Yomi—Tzvi Horowitz offers a 2nd Daf Yomi shiur after Shacharit Sunday through Friday!

Rosh Chodesh Shiur—Next Shabbat, March 1st, Parashat Terumah, Rabbi Gelman and TDK join EDOS on Shabbat afternoon for a class, Mincha, Seudah Shlishit and Maariv. Walk To Free the Hostages—Meets at Washington Park every Sunday at 2:00 PM to walk around the lake until all are freed. Meeting place is at Mississippi Avenue, at the entrance to park. Run For Their Lives is a global initiative with over 200 groups around the world, to raise awareness for the immediate release of the hostages still being held in Gaza by the terrorist organization Hamas. Most of the hostages are civilians, including 14 women, 9 elderly over the age of 65, and 2 children. The Denver group runs/walks 1 mile
